Reflection Questions for Your Study Circle Plan

Use these questions as a guide when describing how your study circle works.

This is what we want to learn or improve:

- What specific knowledge or skills do participants want to develop? Give concrete examples.
- Are there different skill levels within the group? How is this managed?

This is how we plan to work (methods and approaches):

- What does a typical session look like?
- How is the balance between independent work and joint activities?
- How are instructions given individually, in groups, through demonstrations? Are the instructions verbal, written, or in another form?
- Who gives the instructions? Is there a leader, or do participants take turns?

We will use the following working/study materials:

- Which materials are provided or commonly used, and which can participants choose on their own?
- Are books, templates, or digital resources used? List titles or insert links.
- How are the materials used? For example, photos for creative inspiration, books that explain a certain process, etc.

In the short term, we hope the circle will lead to:

- What skills or projects should participants develop this term?
- How are progress and learning shown through concrete results or increased understanding?

In the long term, we hope the circle will lead to:

- How can participants continue to develop after the study circle?
- Are there plans for continuing the study circle or doing independent work?

This is how we ensure everyone feels involved:

- How is an inclusive and inspiring group environment created?
- How are participants encouraged to share knowledge and ideas?
